



Research Poster Review Criteria 1

Criteria	Rating (1-5; 5 highest)	Comments
Research plan clearly defined		
Explanation of what stage the research has reached-- what is the current status compared to projected outcomes		
Collaborative procedures delineated (who, what, how, where)		
Quality of presentation and communication of research		
Description of how research fits into a broader research agenda		



Research Poster Review Criteria 2

Question	Rating (1-5; 5 highest)	Comments
Does the poster state the problem or research question that is being addressed?		
Does it present the motivation and significance of the research?		
Does it establish a solution or the research needed to address the problem or question?		
Does it explain the approach or methods used in the research?		
Does it distinguish proposed research, research in progress, or completed work?		
Are the data/subjects clearly presented?		
Are results or expected results displayed?		
Are references provided and do they following appropriate standards?		
Is it presented to facilitate easy reading? (e.g., top to bottom, left to right, center outward)		



Research Poster Review Criteria 3

Clearly formulates the problem that is being addressed by the research and its significance.		
Presents related work and what remains to be done.		
Describes what the presenter did and how it is better than what was done before		
Presents a novel approach.		
Attractiveness: the presentation should be interesting.
